

Rules for entry and return to the Czechia (as of 5th February 2021)

for travels exceeding 12 hours

There are exceptions from these rules, particularly for the international transport and regular cross-border movement (cross-border workers, pupils and students, persons having rights of custody or rights of visitation).

**Obligations of persons arriving from the countries with a low, medium, high and very high risk contagion of coronavirus infection
effective from February 5th 2021 in accordance with the Ministry of Health Protective Measure**

<i>When</i>	<i>Obligation</i>
Before arrival to the territory of the CR	To fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form: www.prijezdovyformular.cz
	To undergo a test of COVID-19 max 48 hours before the arrival according to a colour of country (not needed for green countries).
During/upon arrival to the territory of the CR	To present a document on completion of the electronic Arrival form in the event of a border or residence check.
After entering the territory of the CR	To undergo an RT-PCR test of COVID-19 within 5 days after the arrival (for red countries) and no sooner than 5 days after the arrival (for a dark red countries). An RT-PCR test is not needed for green and orange countries.
	To send an e-mail to a regional Public Health Office (pendleri@khsbrno.cz) and to a relevant person of BUT (supervisor for ex.) with a negative/positive result of the RT-PCR test of COVID-19. In case of positive result also to the University crisis staff (karantena@vutbr.cz). It isn't allowed to go to work and to the university without a negative result of the RT-PCR test. The employer/the university has to restrict the access to all facilities and workplaces.
	It is only allowed to go to the doctor, to go shopping, to public administrations (if necessary), otherwise must stay at the place of residence.
For a period of 10 days after the arrival	To wear a respirator FFP2 or a surgical mask and to follow the restrictions or the protective measures of the Czech government and Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic (anti-epidemic system called PES).
